Everyone needs support sometimes.

The support that we may need will be different for every person, and that's just the same for people who have Down Syndrome. Getting the right support at the right time opens up opportunities for people who have Down Syndrome; so they can live the lives they want, giving them choice, control and dignity.

At our school we do our utmost to support all of our families when needed. We understand that the families of children with disabilities will face differing challenges. For example, support and therapy may be required to develop language, social skills, or motor skills.

Safeguarding children with additional needs (including Down Syndrome) is a vital consideration for us as we are aware that they may be placed at greater risk of abuse due to: communication barriers, the signs of abuse being misunderstood or minimised, increased isolation and greater dependence on others for their care, a lack of education to help them to stay safe, and inadequate support.

At Withycombe Primary we are proud to support WDSD by wearing our colourful, mismatched socks to help raise awareness about Down Syndrome and it was great to see so many people highlighting this campaign in school, alongside those wearing red for Comic Relief which was on the same day!
