In Geography we will be learning about Kibera in Kenya, we will be finding out more about growing and life-cycles in Science and getting creative in DT making Ferris wheels. We will be using the story 'Fatou, fetch the water' as inspiration for our story writing in Literacy.

Many thanks for your ongoing support with home learning and with reading. It is really important that you are reading regularly with your children at home. They currently read in groups regularly in school, but we would like them all to be confident readers by the end of the school year. If your child is accessing Little Wandle Books then these are updated weekly online. Paper copies of books at their assessed level will also be shared weekly and we would like you to read these together as often as possible. If your child is no longer following the Little Wandle phonics programme, we would like you to focus on fluency, comprehension and reading stamina.

We will continue to post weekly activities on Seesaw and your child will need to carry on practising spelling and reading their common exception words. These have been updated and sent home in bookbags.

Our PE days will continue to be on a Wednesday and Friday. Please send your child into school wearing their PE kit (green polo shirts, black shorts & trainers). Children may wear their school jumper/cardigan/PE hoodie. It is also important that your child brings in a named water bottle each day as well as their book bag and coat.
