



Key Instant Recall Facts Year One - Spring 1



I can read and write numbers up to twenty in numerals and words

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to be able to recall these facts **instantly**.

Children should be able to write all numbers up to 20 in numerals and words. Teen numbers can be tricky!

The digits should be formed in the correct orientation; 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9.

The spelling of some of the numbers will take time to master. Encourage your child to use their phonics knowledge to segment the words.

One	Eight	Fifteen

Three	Ten	Seventeen

Top Tips

It is important to practise these facts **little** and **often**. You do not have to practise them all at once; you could choose a fact for the day. You could practise these KIRFs whilst out shopping or when you see numbers on road signs. If you would like more ideas on how to support your child's learning, please speak to their teacher.

Things to try at home

- Make a set of cards with the numerals and words. Play matching games.
- Practise spelling the words out using different mediums; chalk, pens, pencils, or trace them in the sand at the beach.
